# Míníster's Column

This year I didn't go to our Unitarian Universalist Association's General Assembly, but I found myself very much missing it. So, I did something I've never done before, which is watch the live videos of the plenary sessions, even though I was unable to vote from my home office. The activity of watching the plenary sessions was made more interactive by the fact that I was using twitter to follow and participate in some of the conversation about what was happening. It was a moment of amazement for me to see what changes have been made by technology. I was learning, through video, Twitter, Facebook and blogs, about the decisions that were happening at General Assembly in real time, and able to hold conversations with colleagues and UU members around the country as things were happening. Of course, this doesn't replace the real experience of attending a General Assembly, and if you've never attended one, I encourage you to do so. There's nothing like it. It's a wonderful experience to see thousands of UUs from all over the country (and world) and exchange ideas, learn new things, and experience the holy together.

This was an exciting year at our General Assembly. First, we elected a new UUA president. That was something I was able to vote in, and we had our delegates voting as well by absentee ballot. The new UUA president is Rev. Peter Morales, someone whom my husband and I both attended seminary with, and who I know will do a fine job. He is a dynamic and passionate speaker on the issue of growth, and we are certainly hoping that these years with him as president will be years to grow our faith.

The second major issue before the General Assembly was a proposal to considerably change Article II of the UUA Bylaws, otherwise known as the Principles and Purposes. This vote failed for a number of reasons, one of which was frustration that many delegates felt with a process that did not allow for any amendments to the new proposed Principles and Purposes document. While I agree with this decision, it is also definitely necessary for us, as an association, to review the Principles and Purposes regularly. Some people feel it's important to change them regularly, too, lest they become enshrined as a creed. More drastic than the changes proposed to the Principles were the changes proposed to the section following them known as the "Sources." I very much like our current "Sources" statement, and so, beginning in the fall, I'll be doing a sermon series, spread out over the year, on the sources from which we draw our faith. Our UUA General Assembly passed several "Actions of Immediate Witness" (AIWs) this year, too. They are:

- AIW 1: Advocate Pending Legislation Toward Clean, Honest, and Fair Elections in the United States
- AIW 2: U.S. Ratification of the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty
- AIW 3: In Support of America's Red Rock Wilderness Act
- AIW 4: Support Bolivian UUs Struggling for Justice and Human Rights
- AIW 5: U.S.-Sponsored Torture: A Call for a Commission of Inquiry
- AIW 6: Oppose Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity-Based Violence in Iraq

There are also two current UUA "Study/Action Issues": Peacemaking and Ethical Eating. We have some exciting ways to learn about these various issues and join in the advocacy work, from guest speakers, to commUnity forums, to passing congregational resolutions. If one of these subjects inspires you, and you'd like to see our congregation do some work around it and have some ideas how, please let me know.

# Religious Education Report

Hard to believe that summer's half over already! We had a good turnout at Summer RE in June, then just one child besides nursery kids on July 12, so she played in the nursery too and the teachers who were lined up enjoyed the "Friendship and Love in Music" service. That's ok, we'll just hold that lesson over and see if there are kids to do RE with on July 26. There will be two lessons in August, too, and I thank Gretchen Marshall, Kerry Hart, Rob Gaecke, and Peter Morrison for helping teach this summer.

I'm glad to report that, with some additional pledges and commitments of individuals to help cover our janitorial needs, it looks like we will be able to restore the RE program to full funding this year. We're still pursuing grants and would love for church members to suggest special fundraising ideas as well.

We are gearing up for the fall already. I hope the RE Committee will be able to meet with the Worship Committee in August—a joint meeting is so helpful in planning worship and RE calendars! Then we'll set dates for training/ start-up sessions, to familiarize teachers with this fall's curriculum and the "Rules and Regulations" for RE teaching. Finally, an important part of these meetings is scheduling teachers, so we know who's teaching when. There's nothing more satisfying than a completed RE Calendar! We'll probably have the K-5 and middle/high school teachers meet separately, so each group can schedule together and have time to review their curriculum.

So here's how you can be involved, even if you're not teaching this Fall: I've listed items (see page 4) that the RE program needs for the curriculum, and the more that's donated, the less needed to purchase with the RE budget. #### UUCEL On-Line Easy On-Line Fundraisers

UUCEL has three easy ways you can earn money for the church while going about your usual on-line activities. The first is through Amazon.com. If you're shopping at <u>Amazon.com</u>, first go to our church webpage at <u>www.libertyuu.org/shop.html</u> and click on the link to Amazon. Once you do that, the church will earn a percentage (usually 4%) of the amount you spend at Amazon.

The second method is to use GoodSearch as your search engine. It works like other search engines, such as Google. Whenever you're searching the web, go to <u>www.GoodSearch.com</u>, enter Universalist Unitarian Church of East Liberty as your agency you're fundraising for, and then every time you search the web we make a penny.

Third, use GoodShop before shopping. Go to <u>www.GoodShop.com</u> and enter Universalist Unitarian Church of East Liberty as your agency, and then click from there to any number of on-line business, from e-Bay to Orbitz to iTunes, and when you make your purchase at the store, UUCEL will earn a portion of your sales.
