Minister's Column

I've had a good study leave and vacation, and now come back to our fall refreshed and ready to start new potential events and opportunities. Going to General Assembly was a wonderful part of my summer, because it's a strong reminder for me of what unites us, what the purpose of our faith is, and what we are called to do in our communities.

Our congregation has taken strong stands in our community by becoming a welcoming congregation, by hanging the "Standing on the Side of Love" banner, by coming to protests and rallies and school board and town hall meetings. We continue to make a space in the community for reason and education through our Community Forum series. But I think there's still a need for us to do more—my own soul is yearning for us to be making a deeper impact in our community through greater work that we share together. The way I envision this coming to fullness is through a social service program where we partner with different agencies among the ones that we have voted to support, and arranging projects that our members can participate together in. What I need to make this dream a reality is a few interested, dedicated volunteers. If this work is calling you, too, let me know.

At General Assembly I heard the author of *Good Without God*, Rabbi Greg Epstein, speak. I've been following his work as the Harvard Humanist Chaplain for a couple of years, out of interest in the fact that he's a humanist, a chaplain, and a graduate of my alma mater, U of M, as well. He talked about what the Harvard Humanist group is doing, and what brings them together without a shared creed. The answer was that they spend less time talking and more time doing. They do some shared meditation together, but much of their time isn't spent in worship or in business meetings; it's spent out building houses, serving food, mentoring children, and working in partnership with the interfaith community. I didn't agree with all that he said, but his point about getting out there and doing things you believe in together is well taken. I think it could build a more excited, integrated, and dynamic church for us to be doing more of this.


