Minister's Column

I'm writing you from our family's second annual trip to SUUSI, a Unitarian Universalist summer camp for all ages held in Radford, Virginia on the Radford University campus. It's the second largest annual gathering of Unitarian Universalists, the largest being our annual General Assembly. While I'm here I'm leading workshops on blogging and on science fiction and fantasy. Both are well-attended and going well, although there are certainly many people here that know more than me about both subjects.

A UU camp experience is something I wish I had had when I was a child, and I'm glad my daughter is having this experience. She already has friends who remember her from last year that she eagerly greeted, which is great for her. What is great for me is knowing that she has one more experience in her life to help her in connecting to Unitarian Universalism and one more experience which teaches her Unitarian Universalist values and beliefs.

Some areas in our country have UU camps like this that are held on facilities that we rent, and some areas have UU campgrounds. Our Heartland District has been a district that doesn't have a UU campground, although a few smaller UU camps have been held in our district (there's one for singles, AMUUSE, that meets in Saugatuck, Michigan). Overall, however, going to a UU camp is not as much a part of our UU experience as it is for UUs in the Southeast, who seem to have someone from most churches here. However, as of the beginning of July, we are not in the Heartland District, but the MidAmerica region, and the MidAmerica region has camp Unistar, a camp in Minnesota that runs for ten weeks in the summer. It would be great if one of the things that happened with this regionalization is we found more UUs from our region involved in these great faithbased camps during the summer. This

August we have first weekend board meeting of the MidAmerica region. As one of the new board members, I'll be gone for the last weekend in August to attend that board meeting in Illinois. I'll look forward to knowing more about our region and the strengths it offers, and being able to share that information with you.

Meanwhile, don't forget to collect water from your summer locations, whether that's your backyard hose, Clark Lake, or places farther flung. I'll try to remember to bring back some water from SUUSI for you!

Please let me know if you have or would like to donate any of the items listed below:
