When I'm stressed and have no time, that's when I need to take time for spiritual practice — meditation, singing, journaling, yoga, or whatever it may be. If you're finding yourself stressed and strapped this winter, come join us and sing or pray or laugh until your heart feels whole and free again.

Another thing that feeds my soul is our mission and vision in the larger community. In February we're in the time of the Season for Nonviolence and African-American History month, and also the time of year that's been newly connected to the UUA's Standing on the Side of Love campaign. Report

Time marches on...faster and faster it seems, after the New Year started.
At our January Religious Education committee meeting, I heard good things about Santa's Workshop and Gifts for Kids, two December programs. Sounds like the Santa's Workshop day was a lot of fun, with crafts like foam art (thanks Michelle!), frosting cookies (Vicki), orange pomanders and pine cones (Dee and Gretchen), and Marina demonstrating an ornament- sewing craft.

The RE Committee has been charged with identifying monthly social action opportunities for families, and quarterly social opportunities. In January we will donate change provided by kids and their families to Heifer International. In February we'll encourage UUCEL families to purchase valentine gifts through Equal Exchange, and we'll see if we can pick a date to visit the far trade shops in Chelsea together, to learn more about fair trade at work in two retail stores there. We'll announce the date soon!

Another tradition takes place every February. We'll ask those who would like to be "Church Buddies" to fill in forms to exchange information on themselves. This one will be "double blind," where we pair adults and children without letting either know the name of their "church buddy." Children will write notes and provide home-made gifts, while adults buy inexpensive gifts of \$0-5 weekly and a final gift worth \$5-10. This year we will run Church Buddies from the 2nd weekend in February through the first weekend in March, the day of the Church Buddies breakfast and the "RE Sunday," where we give the church a sense of what the K-5 class is learning. (The youth class is often featured nearer the end of the school year.)

"Torn Between Fuzzy Aspirations and Hard Realities"....This year we are pleased and honored to present the Rev. Dr. Mark Morrison-Reed as our keynoter for our District Assembly March 31-April 1st. Mark writes this about his keynote:

There is a surprising, and painful, truth behind Unitarian Universalist efforts to become more racially and culturally diverse. This truth must begin with taking an honest look at who we are and why we are who we are, and it ends in a conundrum but not without hope. If UUs really want to change, accepting the truth is the only place to start. Torn between our reality and our aspirations what are we do do? This presentation considers why achieving diversity is challenging, but also talks about which congregations became successfully diverse and how.

Mark's presentation will be part of our look at what it means to be UUs committed to living in a world transformed, multi-cultural, multi-generational, multi-racial, and many other multi's. Our weekend together should be the perfect lead in to this year's Justice General Assembly in Phoenix, Arizona, in June. We hope to have a workshop based on the UUA's "Common Read" for 2012, and have time to discuss immigration issues that arise here in our Heartland.

What is District Assembly?

Each year, in early April, District Assembly is the time we come together to learn from each other, join together in worship, and renew our commitment and understanding of what it means to be a Unitarian Universalist. It is also the time we come together to conduct the business of the District. Our keynote speaker brings a message to inspire and rejuvenate all who attend.
