Minister's Column

For the last several years, the Standing on the Side of Love Campaign has had a "Thirty Days of Love" initiative that has gone from mid-January to the Sunday nearest Valentine's Day, called "Share the Love Sunday." This year it is from January 18th through February 16, so we are in the midst of it right now. The Thirty Days of Love program called itself a "Spiritual Journey for Social Justice" and has daily activities about how to spread love and justice. Information can be found at http://www.standingonthesideoflove.org. They have a wealth of ideas, but the general gist is to reach out and do something for love and justice this month. I have a few suggestions of ways our church or church members are involved that you could tap into this month if you're interested:

- Our church is one of the churches involved in the Jackson Personal Care Ministry. This important resource collects and distributes personal care items to our Jackson-area neighbors in need of assistance. You can donate items for the Personal Care Ministry in the baskets in the social hall, or volunteer to help on the third Thursday when our church is one of the churches involved in passing out the items at First Baptist Church in Jackson. To volunteer, contact Nena Obits.
- The Jackson Together group is working again to get a civil rights ordinance passed by the Jackson City Council that bans discrimination against gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender individuals in public accommodations, employment, and housing. Two ways to get involved are to go to the next Jackson Together Meeting on Saturday, February 22 at 2pm at City Hall, or to go to the next City Council meeting on February 25th and share your support.
- A few of our members have been getting involved with the Jackson Area Civil Rights Awareness Association (JACRAA). JACRAA is holding book discussions on The New Jim Crow on Tuesday evenings 6-8pm at St. John's UCC. Those book discussions will be continuing through mid-February. Meetings of JACRAA are held every Wednesday at 10:30 am at First Congregational Church. Whether you choose to get involved in one of these organizations or

whether you choose to get involved in one of these organizations or not, I hope you find a way this month to stand on the side of love and get involved in your community.

Report

A new year always brings anticipation of new events at UUCEL's RE program. We often start a new curriculum, as we did this month with "Sing to the Power" by the Rev. Lynn Ungar. The goals from this curriculum are to:

- Explore kinds of power that can be used to create positive change
- Enrich Unitarian Universalist identity with stories of people who used their power for the sake of "justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love"
- Develop participants' sense of themselves as leaders
- Promote exercising one's own powers to create positive change, even in very small ways
- Build community, with an emphasis on the power of religious community to change the world for the better.

We do this with stories, art projects and activities, using the metaphor of the four elements—earth, air, fire and water—as a framework to explore different forms of power. Kids seem to be enjoying the lessons so far, and I am especially handing out "kudos" to Kerry H. and Laura T. for teaching a class of nine, including two young visitors, on January 19! Thank you also to Vic fM. or getting the schoolhouse furnace fixed.

A couple of special events coming up: first, Church Buddies month is February, and I'm looking for both children and adults who would like to participate: kids fill out the form included on the top of page 4, adults just let me know. We decided to make this "one way" again this year, with adults knowing who the children are, and doing little gifts for them along the following themes, with a \$0-5 limit for the first three weeks and a \$5-10 limit for the final week:

- 1) Food baked goods or little treats
- 2) Craft or homemade item
- 3) Re-gifted
- 4) Open to any appropriate gift!
 At the end of the month we will have an RE breakfast on **Sunday, February 23** at 10:00 am, and in March we'll have an RE Sunday, when Continued on next column...

the kids will share with adults what they've been learning about in church this year. We will also have an adults-give-to-adults Church Buddies month in the future, to be announced.

We are hoping to hold a Peace Camp this Summer, our version of "Vacation Bible School." As we plan this going forward, we could use a few other adults for this committee, and of course volunteers to execute it in August. Let me know if you're interested!

In February and after our thoughts also turn to what curriculum we will be using in the next church year, and who will we recruit to help with all the volunteer jobs of the RE program. We will probably have enough children to split into two age groups, K-4 and 5th through 8th grades next year. So that will call for more volunteer teachers. What better way to "be the change you want to see in the world?"
