Minister's Column

I don't usually make New Year's resolutions, but this year I've got a few, hoping to be better at the many hats I wear: minister, mother, spouse, teacher (adjunct at JCC), board member (of Family Services and Children's Aid), colleague, and individual person. My life needs greater attention to the balance of these things, and that's my goal for the new year. I'm taking some time off at the beginning of January for rest and renewal.

When I get back, there'll be some new things happening at our church. I'm starting up a new "adult" RE class (actually, it's for adults and children—for families!). We have an interesting forum planned on the economy. At the end of January I'll be away for a half week for a conference, this one on "Appreciative Inquiry." Some of you may remember that we used Appreciative Inquiry in a growth workshop with a district consultant last year. I'm looking forward to learning more about the process.

In February we'll be celebrating the 200th anniversary of the birth of Charles Darwin. If you're interested in planning a celebration, let me know! We'll have a forum on the topic, a Sunday service, a special social hour, and who knows what else! February also brings Secret Friends month, a time for children and adults in the congregation to get to know each other better through exchanges of notes and small gifts. I've enjoyed my own secret friends in the past, and encourage those of you who've never tried it to give it a go this year.

Early this year I encourage you to, along with me, read the Big Read book – *The Grapes of Wrath* – which we'll be talking about in March. We'll have a forum on *The Grapes of Wrath*, as well, with a look at poverty in Jackson.

It looks like the start to a good year at UUCEL, but if you have something that you're interested in seeing the church do, I encourage you to talk to me or a board member or committee chair about it. We'd love to have more members lead programs like Peggy Smith did with the "Yoga for Advent" series, and if members have a program they're interested in but not comfortable leading, we'd like to hear about those as well. It may feel like there's too much going on to attend it all, but that's a good sign of a healthy and growing church! Namaste, Cindu

Religious Education Report

Happy New Year! I hope your holidays have been filled with joy, and peace. I took a little extra time off from my "9 to 5" job to organize my tax and Religious Education (RE) paperwork—so let's hope that "take time to get organized" new year's resolution comes to fruition! It really does take time to have a successful RE program. Along with my preparatory time for each week's lessons, the RE volunteers take time to read the lessons ahead, and often prepare activities/craft projects ahead, as well. Parents bring their kids to pageant practices, and volunteers prepare "Santa's Workshop" and other special projects. I am grateful for the investment of time and energy that many members and friends of this church devote to RE.

I think the time spent on preparing for the pageant was worth it—don't you? It came off wonderfully, thanks to the investment of time from all of our actors, as well as our music director, Nancy Cooper, and song leader, Gretchen Marshall. Thanks also to Anne Seifert, who helped decorate the "set." Children enjoyed lunches of pizza and "rotini spaghetti" at the Saturday practices. Meredith Baither, Anne Seifert, and Kathy and Vicki Haynes helped with "Santa's Workshop" craft stations after the pageant. (Hope I haven't left anyone out!)

Speaking of pizza, who knew that teens could eat so much of it? We had our first Interfaith Youth meeting on Sunday night, December 7, and many teens and their youth leaders joined us from St. Johns United Church of Christ. The teens are interested in meeting monthly, and we hope to make this a traveling group, visiting different religious facilities in the area and introducing more and more potential youth participants to the group in this way. Our next meetings will be January 11 and then February 1, and we'll keep you posted on locations and times.

As we resume RE lessons after the holidays, the teens and 'tweens will continue to study the life of Jesus, and have visitors to tell them more about Judaism. The K-5 class will continue to have interesting lessons from the new curriculum, "Moral Tales," where each Sunday a story illustrates a theme from our "moral compass." And preschoolers will enjoy their lessons from the curriculum We are Many, We are One. Also in January, watch for the "Church Friends" sign-up sheets. They'll be due Jan. 18th so I can let you know about your "match" by January 25 (see related article).

We are still in need of donations of white posterboard, 11 x 17" drawing paper pads, and/or gift cards to Meijer, Office Depot, etc. to purchase these. Thank you for your ongoing support—it means so much to me, and to all of our volunteers!

"How to be a "Church Friend"

While we're renaming "Secret Friends" to "Church Friends" this year, the traditions remain essentially the same. We'll do the "double blind" method again this year, where neither the child NOR the adult know who their assigned "Church Friend" is.

The profile information I give you should give you all you need to know to be a "Church Friend." Adults, buy or make gifts in the \$2-5 value for Sundays, Feb. 1-15, and perhaps a bigger gift for Feb. 22, but **spend no more than \$8 – \$20 total** on your Church Friend. Children, try to leave a note or "goodie" up to \$5 in value for your Church Friend every week, too, with perhaps a nicer gift for Feb. 22, but again, spend no more than \$20 total on your Church Friend; less or "all home-made" ok.

You will have a bag with an assigned "symbol" on it, and a matching one for your Church Friend. One set will be on the hat shelf in the foyer outside the sanctuary, and the other set will be on the windowsills in the social hall. At the Church Friends breakfast at 10am on Feb. 22, we will "reveal" the matches; so see if you can keep your identity a secret until then!

A few things to keep in mind:

- 1) There are people with differing financial means who attend church. Try not to make this a contest of who can give/get the "neatest stuff." Also, accept homemade gifts and food items with the love in which they are given.
- 2) If you cannot attend on a Sunday during Church Friends month, see if a friend can deliver your Church Friend's gift for you, or let Sharon know as a last resort. On the other hand, recognize that time conflicts come up, and perfect attendance of your "Church Friend" is rare. If you miss a Sunday, it's still best to "make it up" the next week, with two notes/gifts/etc.
