Minister's Column

Dear UUCEL Members & Friends,

I won't be seeing much of you this month — July is the month when I take most of my study leave and vacation. I'll be reachable by my home phone and cell

phone, though, for pastoral care emergencies and other emergencies. Should such arise, please don't hesitate to call. When I'm out of town, I tell board members how best to reach me, too, so if you have trouble reaching me, contact a board member. I take my cell phone with me when I'm out of town, and try to check messages on my home voicemail every 2-3 days when out of town. I'll be in town for most of the month, however.

Many may wonder just what a minister's study leave is for. I get four weeks of study leave annually, and take one after Christmas and three in July. What are they used for? Well, mostly they're used to read up on subjects for the next year. While four years of seminary prepares one well to preach on a wide variety of subjects such as world religions, church management, UU history, and the Bible, every year I also tackle a whole host of new topics, many on subjects that weren't even on the radar during my seminary days, which are now over a decade ago. During the average week during the regular church year, I have one day set aside for sermon writing (Fridays), and while I can sometimes use two Fridays and parts of my Saturdays to work on an individual sermon, the writing itself of what is about a six to eight page paper every week often takes up much of that time. Reading two to three books for a new topic is something that is hard to schedule in during the year. So over the month of July I begin by planning my worship schedule for the next year, and selecting the different sermon topics I'll be doing, and then I try to figure out which sermon topics are going to take the most research, and I begin that research. I'm also a member of a minister's study group, something that helps me to keep up with new ideas and continue to hone my writing abilities. The topic for the minister's study group always has "required reading," and I try to do that over the summer. I then use that research to plan a sermon around that topic. You might remember the three-sermon series I did on poetry. That was a study group topic that I was preparing a paper on, and my academic paper began as the three sermons. This year's study group topic is "Space." I'm not sure yet what sermons might come out of that one!

One highlight of my month will be attending the Southeast UU Summer Institute, or "SUUSI," which is one of the UU summer camps.

Report

It's looking like extra pledges will make it possible for the part-time staff at UUCEL to remain employed for at least a portion of their previous hours. Thank you for your generosity in helping shape young UU minds! For Sharon and Vicki this year that means staffing 10 months of the year, taking off some unpaid time in the summer.

Since I will be on vacation for the last two weeks in June, and off duty in July, I have set up a preliminary RE schedule starting in August and going the whole school year. I am now busy confirming the schedule with teachers, and will get August lessons out to teachers this week.

Our strategy was to recruit a set of regular teachers for K-6 who could be primarily in charge of lessons approximately once a month; a set of subs/occasional teachers who could be "assistant K-6 teachers;" and also a set of semi-regular assistants to Vicki in the nursery. I was hoping for more K-6 volunteers, but am pleased to say that in addition to last year's subs, we have a few additional who have said they would teach occasionally, and several who have said that they would do the nursery regularly; so the time commitment is spread out somewhat among several dedicated souls!

For youth and adults, we'll have a Sunday night movie each month that touches on the 7 principles and/or religion/faith issues, then have separate youth and adult discussion groups immediately following. The dates for these movies are to be announced - see August and September newsletters!
