Minister's Column

Hi UUCEL Members & Friends,

Are you wondering what I'm doing this November, while I'm starting my sabbatical? I'm starting off with a week of vacation that I've sandwiched into the sabbatical time, which will provide me with a break from my regular routine. After that, well, it's back to a routine, of sorts. Every November for the last few years I've been attending a UU ministers' study group, "Ohio River Group." I'll be going down to Dayton for a few days for that again, just as before. Our study topic is the broad topic of "Ministry and Popular Culture" this year, and I'm looking forward to the fact that I get to hear the papers and am *not* delivering one of my own this year (I did a paper last year—our papers are 45 minutes long, followed by 15-minute response papers).

I'm thinking strongly about attending the Michigan UU Social Justice Network (MUUSJN) conference that's this November (details on page 5). When the topic was announced, I was pretty focused on immigration issues as the main pull for me, because our UU General Assembly this past June had focused so heavily on immigration issues, and it was clear that this was going to be the focus of a major social justice effort by the UUA. Now, having experienced all the tragic losses of October in the LGBT community, I'm glad that the MUUSJN conference is also focusing on these issues, as well. I encourage you to attend this important conference, too. These are major issues our movement is tackling, and we could use some good thinking about how to engage them as a congregation.

Also in November is a PFLAG-sponsored vigil for LGBT suicides and victims of violence. We've been asked to sign on as a congregation, and our board will officially affirm this at their next board meeting, but has given their approval for UUCEL to endorse this vigil, as we have congregational votes in favor of supporting PFLAG and for being a Welcoming Congregation. This is the sort of event that it's very hard for me to stay away from, and I'm weighing whether or not to attend. Since I'm also teaching at JCC, and the Gay-Straight Alliance of JCC is also a sponsor, I may attend with that hat on. I won't, however, be able to attend the Interfaith Thanksgiving Eve Service, which I've been a part of for the last several years, and I'll miss it. I encourage you to attend this service. Last year it was really phenomenal, with prayers offered from Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Baha'i, and Native American practitioners (and probably others, too, that I'm forgetting). This year promises to be just as good a true interfaith worship experience.

Between those scheduled events, I hope to start work on some projects, maybe have time to worship at some other locations and experience different worship styles, and have time for contemplation and reflection. I'll be missing you and holding you in my thoughts.



Sabbatical Social Media Policy

Facebook: A lot of people may be wondering what's going to happen on Facebook during my sabbatical. Those members who my Facebook "Friends" are used to seeing me post, and having me comment on some of their posts. (I will happily friend any church member who sends me a friend request. However, I do not friend minors, members of other churches who I don't know from outside connections, and friends who are not yet members may be put on hold before I friend back.) During my sabbatical, the church's Facebook page will be administered by Chris Keith and Michelle Vanover. If you know of something that you think should be advertised there, please give it to one of these volunteers. With my personal account, I'll be "hiding" UUCEL members from my newsfeed, and I'll be locking my posts and other materials so that UUCEL members aren't seeing my information come up during the sabbatical. Some ministry-related contacts in the Jackson community may see that I'm applying the same policy towards them on Facebook, as well. That's because my sabbatical needs to be a break from my ministry work in the community, as well. Just like with e-mail, the messaging will still be available, but I'll be unreliable about answering it, and I ask that it only be used in case of emergency. Also, if we have mutual friends, you may still see me posting

on their status updates. Feel free to treat this the same way you would if you ran into me at the grocery store—it's okay to say hi and ask me how things are going, just avoid telling me about what's going on at church and asking my opinion on church-related matters. However, my public Facebook page at <u>http://www.facebook.com/RevCyn</u> will still be open and viewable to UUCEL members, and I intend to continue to post things with ministry and UU content there, and UUCEL members should feel free to comment there, as well.

Twitter: If you're following me on Twitter, you may have realized I almost never check my Twitter account. That will continue to be true! However, I'll still be posting things at my RevCyn Facebook page, and those items feed directly into Twitter, so there will still be activity on my Twitter account.

Religious Education Report

We're coming in to a fun time of the year, with fewer RE classes to staff and more intergenerational services and activities. The RE Committee and I will be choosing a winter pageant soon that will be fun and easy for the children to present in December. I will be asking RE teachers to meet during a social hour to complete the January through June 2011.

As you may have heard, the RE Committee has taken responsibility to research and coordinate service opportunities monthly. In September, we participated with the AIDS Walk, and in October the CROP Walk. The congregation is invited to participate in the Suitcase and Duffle Drive, from Oct 23-December 5. Topics to be discussed in the future include: multigenerational experiences, building the RE committee, family recruitment, administering adult RE, and nursery best practices. I already came away with ideas for recruitment. I used to attend these meetings a few years ago and am glad that my job schedule allows me the flexibility to attend again. The meetings are energizing and filled with good ideas.

Brooklyn Food Pantry Christmas Food Basket

Our church was sent a letter asking if we would like to participate in this year's upcoming food basket drive for area families in need. The information was sent to us by the Brooklyn Food Pantry, an organization we have voted on to help support and they are asking for our help now. Their needs are higher now than last year with 280 families that will be getting a Thanksgiving and a Christmas Basket. Each participating church will be collecting only one item that goes into the baskets, and our item is small boxes of muffin mix. We need to have 280 boxes of mix by December 5, and taken to the pantry where others will put together each basket and all of the baskets will be same.
