I am personally very excited about some of the conferences going on in October. I have one of my own, my ministerial study group, but there are two other conferences in Michigan that are open to all of you. One is the Jesus Seminar on the Road, which you will find more information about in this newsletter (see attached flyer). The Jesus Seminar is a group of scholars who have done controversial and ground-breaking work on the historical Jesus. Their findings may shock and amaze you, and you can come hear them in person for a very reasonable cost. We also need volunteers for this event, so watch for sign-up sheets.

The second conference is with a group called the Faith Action Network. I met the coordinator of FAN when I was down in Washington, D.C. for the HRC Clergy Call, and am amazed at some of the great work that FAN is doing in Michigan advocating for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender equality. Other UU churches in our state are joining FAN as members, and I hope we can, too. Whether or not you can join this particular conference, FAN is a group that is good to know about and get involved with! If you're interested in being a church liaison to FAN, let me know, because we need someone to help us keep track of lobbying and letter-writing opportunities as they occur.

That's only about a third of what I'm excited about in October. Pore through the rest of these pages and read it all, because there really is something for everyone this month. If you want something scholarly, or fun, or justice-oriented, or familyfriendly, or community-building, or tummy-filling, or crafty, or anything else, look no further than UUCEL! We've got it all here and more.

JDL/UUCEL Community Forum: "Ask Not," an Independent Lens Documentary about the U.S. Military's "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" Policy. "Since the implementation of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell," more than 12,000 military personnel have been discharged including linguists and others whose skills are critical to military operations. In "Ask Not," current and veteran gay soldiers reveal how the policy has affected them during their tours of duty as they struggle to maintain a double life, uncertain of whom they can trust. The film also explores how gay veterans and youth organizers are turning to activism to challenge DADT.
