### Religious Education Report

## 280 Jiffy Muffin Mixes

#### Brooklyn Food Pantry Christmas Food Basket

Our church was sent a letter asking if we would like to participate in this year's upcoming food basket drive for area families in need. The information was sent to us by the Brooklyn Food Pantry, an organization we have voted on to help support and they are asking for our help now. Their needs are higher now than last year with 280 families that will be getting a Thanksgiving and a Christmas Basket. Each participating church will be collecting only one item that goes into the baskets, and our item is small boxes of muffin mix. We need to have 280 boxes of mix by December 5, and taken to the pantry by December 7 where others will put together each basket and all of the baskets will be same.

So.... we have the Christmas Food Basket and collecting 280 small boxes of Jiffy Muffin Mix. It can be any variety; corn muffin, raspberry muffin, blueberry muffin, apple cinnamon muffin, banana muffin, bran with dates muffin, chocolate muffin, oatmeal muffin or even the biscuit mix, but all in the same small size 7oz - 9oz not the large boxes please. Any brand name is OK if the store you shop at does not carry the Jiffy Mix name. A large box will be in the social hall soon to store them till we have collected 280 boxes.

Thanks, watch for sales and bring in what you are able to do. Kathy has volunteered to set this up: the letter was in her mailbox at church and I contacted the board first so it could be printed in this issue of the Bellnote. The next year's schedule for our church to work at the pantry was enclosed in the letter with dates 11 weeks apart with 11 area churches taking turns.
