

Minister's Column in Brief

When I interviewed with the search committee before coming to UUCEL, a member of the search committee asked me if I thought I would preach less often from a manuscript as I gained experience. "No," I responded, "I just hope that my texts will get even better." True to my word, I've been a manuscript preacher this whole time. There are a lot of reasons why I like preaching from a manuscript. It allows me to share my words with people again later (and our recording equipment is currently not working). It allows me to carefully craft some of my sentences. I can quote things more easily and more often. And I don't forget my points or where I am. Mostly, it has to do with my love of the written word. I enjoy the process of writing, even when it's laborious, and I like the result of a written manuscript. I think I'm more eloquent and more precise in written form.

This past month, however, I attended a workshop by Rev. Stephen Shick and Rev. Dr. M'ellen Kennedy, called "Preaching By Heart: the art of preaching without a manuscript—in the Universalist style" (www.preachingbyheart.org). Shick and Kennedy made a powerful argument that extemporaneous preaching, preaching from

As a result of this workshop, I've made a commitment to myself to do more of my preaching extemporaneously. It seems only fitting, since I'm requiring my communications students to do extemporaneous speeches, as well! Hopefully my preaching and my teaching will both strengthen each other.

I hope you will enjoy this new turn in my preaching. It's likely to be less academic and more "by heart."
