In a recent sermon, I apparently confused a lot of people by referring to a conflict at Starr King School for the Ministry, but not explaining what it was about. Here is the short version: The conflict there began with some controversy around the search for their new president. Confidential Search Comm documents were leaked to a wide variety of people. Two students who admitted to receiving the leaked documents had their degrees withheld by Starr King, because they refused to hand over their personal e-mails so that Starr King could investigate who leaked the documents. The students then went public with this information, demanding their degrees. In the aftermath, three faculty members, one staff member, and two board members have resigned from the institution, some with public letters of explanation, and reportedly several students have withdrawn. A number of key leaders, ministers, and UU institutions have made statements of different varieties on the issue, including myself. Spiritual Exercises for February:

This month our theme is "**Faith**." Here are three exercises that you can use to explore your faith.

Six Word Faith: Sometimes talking about faith can wind us in circles. Ultimately, our faith is too complex, visceral and personal to be easily shared. But some have tried to sum up their faith in six words alone. It's a practice that clarifies and amplifies what matters most to us. It helps remind us of and hold on to our deepest commitments. This month, try it for yourself. Come to church on Feb. 8 with your six words. Here are some inspiring examples: "Big bang. No God. Fadeout. End." "Born Jewish. Discovered bacon... still Jewish." "Your inner voice waits for expression." "When love dies, let love remain." "I recognize the feeling of unity." "Can you wonder? Yes you could."

Ignore Your Doubts: All of us know what it's like to lose our faith. We've been betrayed by a relationship, let down by our church community, or convinced that life just won't get better. Our greatest faith often involves the belief that life and others don't deserve our faith in them. But sometimes our doubts need to be doubted. Sometimes life and the people around us need to be given a second chance. This month pick an experience, person or group that you've lost faith in and risk giving it/them another try.

Picture Your Faith: Forget trying to explain it. Sometimes faith is best expressed through images. This month think about what faith *looks like* for you. Find or take a picture of yourself or others "living faithfully." Will it be an image of a singular person lost in prayer, a walk in the woods, two people holding hands, or two enemies putting down their guns? Share your picture on social media if you're comfortable with it, or write a journal entry on what it means to you.
