## Minister's Column

Dear Members & Friends,

I'm writing this column while at Portland for the UUA General Assembly and the UU Minister's Association Ministry Days. I'm aware that while I'm here, the big news will come out from the Supreme Court for the decision about marriage equality in Michigan. As something that I and our church and our association have been working for over decades. this is a pretty exciting moment, and meaningful to our church and its members. I'll be sharing a press release from here in Portland, with the wonderful and gracious volunteer help of Sharon Pedersen. With the hope that same-sex marriage will be legalized, I'm planning that if it is, I will hold a special day at the church, July 11th from 10am to 4pm (or later, if necessary) where I'll perform free weddings for any couple. Of course, I've also told the couples whose marriages I've already performed that when the day comes that they can get legally married in our state that I'll be happy to perform that service as part of the service I've already provided for them.

For me, this moment, should it happen, will mean that the conditions of the pledge I took to not sign licenses will have been fulfilled such that I will sign licenses again. Although I question whether clergy should have any process in a state system, the fact is that we do, and with the state considering limiting who can sign a license to just the clergy, it becomes even more important that I return to doing so when same-sex marriage is legalized.

I have high hopes, but if the Supreme Court should not decide to legalize same-sex marriage in our state and the others states impacted by this, we know that the fight is not over, and the effort for legalization will continue on that long arc towards justice.

## White Privilege White Responsibility

Whites have many privileges in our society, most of them we don't typically notice. With privilege comes responsibility. This is an important concept in the work to end racism.

This summer in partnership with the Jackson District Library, JACRAA (Jackson Area Civil Rights Awareness Association) is offering three programs in a series, "White Privilege/White Responsibility." The purpose is to explore the concept of white privilege and how it covertly supports racism and discrimination. Since whites created and installed racism for economic and social advantage, and since whites support and benefit from racism (albeit unconsciously), the responsibility falls on whites to uncover what they don't see and work toward ending racism. On July 28, the series will present portions of the video "Color of Fear." On August 3, Rev. Dr. Melvin Hitchens, pastor at Community AME Church, will deconstruct the frustration of black males that is presented in the "Color of Fear." On August 25, discussion on the comments of white activist Tim Wise will end the series. All programs are at the Carnegie Auditorium from 6:30 - 8:45 p.m. Please consider joining us.
