Minister's Column

Our theme of "Letting Go" this month is sure to challenge this Type-A minister. "Letting Go" is not something that comes naturally to me – it has to be worked at. But at least working at something is something that I'm used to doing. Spiritual practices have always been like that for me – I have to make a concerted effort to relax, to meditate, to go with the flow or get in the zone. And "Letting Go" is, indeed, a spiritual practice, whether it's letting go of attachment, in the Buddhist sense, letting go of grievances, or letting go in other ways. Zen proverb says, "Let go or be dragged." To truly let go may require faith, or it may require discipline, or it may require courage. A reflection on "Letting Go" by the Soul Matters Sharing Circle says this:

We cling. You name it, we've wrapped our grasping fingers and anxious hearts around it: success, safety, society's standards of beauty, personal desires to be accepted, perfectionism, duty, fear, grudges, hurts, hopes, stuff, shame and privilege. Whether the object of our grasping is good or bad is not, as we learn, truly the issue. It's the grasping itself. That's the real problem. Holding on too long and too tightly is never good for the soul. So our faith pleads with us, "Let it go!"

"Letting go" can also be about dealing with death. In September, we held a well-attended "Death Potluck" where ten of us gathered to share food together and talk about coming to terms with death, among other things. As we turn to the time of year when the veil between the living and the dead is thought to be thinned, we'll also look at death in other ways this month through our exploration of the Day of the Dead, and we may also schedule a second Death Potluck.

Despite the focus on "Letting Go," I go into this month with a lot of excitement. We have programs and events this month that I've been greatly looking forward to. I hope you take time to read this newsletter thoroughly, because it's full of ways to engage with your religious community. I look forward to seeing you at East Liberty.

"Letting Go" Journaling or Dialogue Questions

October's theme is "Letting Go." Here are some questions to consider journaling about or discussing with a confidant this month:

- 1. Are you living in (and holding on to) a story about yourself that isn't letting you grow?
- 2. Are you looking at (and holding on to) a story about others that isn't letting them grow? A story that is blinding you to the wholeness and complexity of who they really are? That is putting them in a box that they don't deserve? That is putting up an unnecessary wall between you and them?
- 3. Are you allowing yourself to be dragged? One of our Soul Matters participants writes, "It took me 10 years of repression and 2 years of rumination before I forgave my exhusband as a gift to myself for my birthday this year, and when I did, I realized how much lighter I felt. ... I'm now exercising my "forgiveness muscle"... because letting go feels so much better than being dragged." How does your forgiveness muscle need a bit more exercising?
- 4. Has letting go of "God" numbed you to "the "love that never lets us go"?
- 5. Do you judge or celebrate those who have let go of God? Has your holding on to God led you to honor or look down upon those who have let God go?
- 6. Is doing your duty driving you farther and farther from yourself?
- 7. Is staying in control controlling you? Is it time to let go of always being in charge?
- 8. Is trying to look a certain way stopping you from seeing yourself?
- 9. Are you ready to forgive yourself? Sometimes the kind of mercy most needed is mercy for oneself. Is it time to let go of being so hard on yourself?
- 10. What's your question? Your question may not be listed above. As always, if the above questions don't include what life is asking from you, spend the month listening to your days to hear it.

2015 Common Read Book: Just Mercy

For the last several years, the Unitarian Universalist Association has announced "Common Read" books. This year's book is an important one for us here in Jackson, so we'll try to hold discussion groups later in the year. Pick up a book from your favorite bookseller and start reading now. Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption by Bryan Stevenson is this year's selection. Stevenson has dedicated his legal career to defending those who are trapped by an often capricious, political, and willfully unjust criminal justice system - poor people, people of color, children, and others over whom the system has run roughshod. It speaks to justice, mercy, and compassion, themes of concern to us as Unitarian Universalists and as human beings. It follows on recent Common Reads, such as The New Jim Crow and Reclaiming Prophetic Witness, and responds to recent statements passed by the delegates to the UUA General Assembly.
