# Minister's Column

The plight of Syrian refugees, shooting of protestors in Minneapolis, Paris bombings, new footage of the brutal shooting of Laquan McDonald in Chicago – the troubles of the world are as present as ever, or more so, this season. And perhaps, like me, you feel that even more than ever we need Christmas with its season of peace, its stillness and quietness and hope and joy. We need Christmas to come into the world again.

My favorite Christmas carol has always been "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day." The song tells of despair about peace on earth, despair in the pain of the world at war and the violence of humanity – "for hate is strong and mocks the song of peace on earth good will to all." But then the bells peal out: "the wrong shall fail, the right prevail, with peace on earth, to all goodwill." And the song ends with, "Till ringing, singing on its way, the world revolved from day to day, a voice, a chime, a chant sublime, of peace on earth, to all goodwill." The way I hear the song, it tells a story of the world going on in the face of violence, but a growing community, a growing chant, arising of peace and goodwill – the arc of the universe bending toward justice.

The Christmas we need isn't the Christmas you'll find at the mall. It isn't the Christmas you'll find on TV. The Christmas we need is the Christmas you find with family and with religious community – the connecting once again to your values, to your dream of peace for the world, and goodwill to all.

May we all find the peace of Christmas this season – at East Liberty and throughout our lives.

For the last several years, the Unitarian Universalist Association has announced "Common Read" books. to the most mundane moments of our lives. This is the challenge that author, David Foster

Wallace, lifted up in his remarkable 2005

Commencement speech. This month challenge yourself with the same message:

~ Make time to repeatedly watch and meditate on his speech: "This is Water"

~ Pay extra attention to the way Wallace links our forgetting with the most mundane moments in our lives.

- ~ Figure out where the call or challenge is for you.
- ~ Exercise your power to choose! Find

Solstice fire rituals. Christmas advent wreaths and calendars. Hanukkah candles. This is the season of ritual — rituals of preparation and expectation to be exact. Expecting and trusting the light to return is no easy task. It's one thing to intellectually believe that the dark always gives way to the light; it's quite another to feel it in your bones. All religions say this task is much easier with ritual, and with rituals done together. So this month, recruit your family or circle of friends and engage one of the winter rituals of expectation.
