Minister's Column

Our theme this month is "Presence." To me, the theme speaks first about our presence in the community. UUCEL makes a lot of difference in the community around us – we're involved in the Jackson Personal Care Ministry, and our JXN Community Forums have been a regular presence for over a decade. Our presence is felt in various social justice initiatives and interfaith events. In the weeks since the presidential election, we've seen a bump in our attendance at East Liberty. I believe that's in part because of our presence in the community as a home for diversity of beliefs and for respecting the inherent worth and dignity of all people. Our presence in this community matters more than ever.

Another thing "presence" says to me is that we are present at East Liberty as individuals. This month we'll be celebrating all the things that your presence gifts us with, through our volunteer recognition where we note the important difference your presence and participation make.

One more thing that the theme evokes for me is something we talk about a lot in the training for the ministry: "ministerial presence." "Ministerial presence" is about growing into the understanding of oneself as a minister, about living into the role and embodying it. Some would argue it's about finding and maintaining a connection to the holy.

It feels appropriate to me, in this last month before my sabbatical, to be thinking on presence, since after this I will be physically absent for a while. In my absence, you may find yourself thinking about what ministerial presence means to you in a different way, and you may find yourself to have ministerial presence in certain ways, as well.

In this last month before my absence, though, we're going to have a lot going on. In these pages you'll find information about our Recognition Sunday and luncheon, about the Children's program and Santa's Workshop, about our monthly forum, the holiday baskets fundraiser, the Christmas Eve service, and more. I hope you'll be present at East Liberty this month for our festivities.

Children are a Blessing, & We Welcome Them! To the Parents of Young Children, May We Suggest: Relax! The “wobble” in young children is a natural part of their development; don't feel like you have to suppress it in this church. All are welcome! Please sit where you'll be most comfortable. In the front it is easier for little ones to see what's going on. The back is convenient if you think you may need to step out with your child, or for those arriving after the service has begun. Sitting near the aisle is easier for children who will be leaving for religious education/Sunday school. Quietly explain the parts of the church service and actions of the minister, ushers, choir, piano player, etc. (Let the minister know if any questions!) Sing the hymns and participate in responsive readings and other parts of the service so that your children learn how things work by example. If you have to leave the service with your child, please feel free to do so; come back when you can! Remember that the way we welcome children to our church directly affects the way that they respond to the church, to spirituality, religion and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship. Please let your child use the reverse side of this card (found in the pews holders) to draw and doodle. *On most Sundays, children are “sung out” to the nursery or classes about 15 minutes after announcements are completed. Children who do not wish to attend class/nursery are welcome to stay with you. Breastfeeding is also welcome.*

To the Members of our Church, May We Suggest: The presence of children is a gift to the church, and a reminder that the church is growing. Please welcome our children and give a smile of encouragement to parents. Leave seats in the back open for any latecomers and parents with little ones. Remember that the way we welcome children to our church directly affects the way that they respond to the church, to spirituality, religion and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship. **Kids:** Please feel free to draw or write on the back! (found in the pews holders)

Our Spiritual Exercises

Option A:

Uncover A World in Itself

“The moment one gives close attention to anything, even a blade of grass, it becomes a mysterious, awesome, indescribably magnificent world in itself.”

~Henry Miller

This exercise invites you to tap into Henry Miller’s magic. Simply do as Miller suggests: **Pick one place, object or animal and give it your attention and presence until it becomes a world unto itself.** Additionally, figure out your own way of recording the progression from a singular or simple object to an entire world. Maybe you keep a journal and write about something new you notice each time you return to it. Maybe take a new photo of it each time and look back at the photos to see what changes and emerges over time. Maybe just sit with your chosen focus for a whole day and see where it takes you. Take your time as you chose your focus. Maybe it is a blade of grass or a singular flower. But then again maybe it’s that food truck outside your office at lunch time. Or the old toolbox your dad passed on to you whose story and world you’ve yet to discover. As always, consider bringing a picture to your group. Seeing your uncovered world, they just might more easily see even more of their own.

Option B:

The Presence of God “Joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God.”- **Pierre Teilhard de Chardin**- Teilhard de Chardin’s quote reminds us that “otherness” is not other. The presence of the divine presents itself in very ordinary forms. And it is a different form for each of us. Yes, it visits many of us through joy. But for others, it is encountered as the presence of hope or longing, reassuring quiet or unexpected kindness.

What is the infallible sign of the presence of the holy for you? Hope? Longing? And when does it come? When you feel most inwardly centered or most outwardly connected? What physical form does it ride in on? The soft wind when you’re walking in the woods? The vibrancy of color as it makes a painting or the sky come alive? The softness of your beloved’s skin? This exercise asks you to name it. Come to your group ready to fill in the blank: “___ is the infallible sign of the presence of holiness for me.” And after you fill in the blank, share one story of when that presence showed up and gave you its gift.

Option C:

Make Your Presents About Presence- “Your children need your presence more than your presents.” – **Jesse Jackson**

It’s not just our children. We all need it. Who wants a new tie when they could have the gift of being seen? Yes, the grandkids want that check from Grandma, but what they will remember is you asking them to join them for a Saturday as you go through the boxes of old stuff in the attic and telling them the stories connected to that so-called junk. This exercise asks you to creatively engage this truth that Jackson lifts up:

Pick at least one person this year and make their holiday present about presence! There are so many ways to come at this. Offer your presence by making the gift something you do together. Show them you are present to them and really see them by picking a gift that reflects something especially unique about them. Or help them be more present to life by giving them a gift that helps them stay focused on what’s important or that helps them step back from the blinding busyness of routine life.

As novelist Cecelia Ahern reminds us, “Sometimes, people can go missing right before our very eyes.” Ultimately, that’s what this exercise is about. Give a gift that helps you find those you love again and helps them find you.

Sabbatical Update

Can you believe that it has been almost six years since Rev. Cindy's last sabbatical? The Board, Worship and Sabbatical Committees are now in the final weeks of preparation for her next sabbatical. The Board and Rev. Cindy have agreed that this sabbatical will not be as long as the last sabbatical. We will have less work for us to cover during her time away; Rev. Cindy's sabbaticals will be shorter and more frequent than called for in her initial agreement. Remember that sabbaticals are a time away from the stress of the job so that one can recharge their spirits and develop new skills and insights. Sabbaticals are very common in the academic world so that teachers can keep up with new ideas and developments.

Rev. Cindy's last official service will be the Christmas Eve Candlelight Service. Be sure to wish her well on her quest! She will then use a week of her vacation time off, and her Sabbatical will officially begin on January 1st, 2017 through March 31st, 2017. She will use another week of vacation as she transitions back into ministerial duties, with her official return to the pulpit scheduled for April 9th, 2017. The service will be about what we (congregation and Rev. Cindy) have learned during the time away. Following that service, we are planning a potluck dinner during social time.

Please, if you see Rev. Cindy and/or her family while she is off, don't pretend that she is invisible and ignore her! Socialize the way you regularly would do.
