Minister's Column

Life never goes exactly as planned. The good news was that I had planned very little for my sabbatical period in order to truly refresh myself. And I did indeed find time to relax, refresh, and renew. The negative part of sabbatical was twofold: (1) I spent about half of it sick from colds and the flu, and (2) I was away from all of you while some really amazing things were happening in our church and community! But it was good to have the time to focus on family transition; since it happened that during the sabbatical our family size shrank back down to the three we were before. This was a good and healthy transition, but I'm prohibited from saying much more in a public forum like this.

One of my goals of sabbatical was to spend some time taking some courses on nonprofit management. Seminary teaches many things - theology, pastoral care, Bible, world religions, church and denominational history, preach - but my seminary experience gave short shrift to the fundamentals of nonprofit management. I had planned to take eight six-hour classes (online), and at this point I've completed five and a half of them: Strategic Management, Resource Development, Board Governance, Social Entrepreneurship, Volunteer Management, and I'm halfway through the class on Marketing. Remaining are Mission-Based Management and Strategic Alliances. You don't learn everything about a subject in a six-hour course, but I am finding some useful tips and techniques in these areas.

Speaking of Strategic Alliances, I believe they're the way of the future. We're doing good work already partnering with Arbor Grove Congregational on youth groups and working with numerous other congregations on social justice and mission work. But there's lots more that can be done. To learn more about this concept, I encourage you to come to this year's Regional Assembly! The RA is in the Chicago area at the end of April - more information is on page 2.

As good as it was to have time for renewal; I'm very much looking forward to returning to church work. There is so much happening in our community right now, and I look forward to talking with you about ideas and priorities.

Children are a Blessing, & We Welcome Them! To the Parents of Young Children, May We Suggest: Relax! The "wiggle" in young children is a natural part of their development; don't feel like you have to suppress it in this church. All are welcome! Please sit where you'll be most comfortable. In the front it is easier for little ones to see what's going on. The back is convenient if you think you may need to step out with your child, or for those arriving after the service has begun. Sitting near the aisle is easier for children who will be leaving for religious education/Sunday school. Quietly explain the parts of the church service and actions of the minister, ushers, choir, piano player, etc. (Let the minister know if any questions!) Sing the hymns and participate in responsive readings and other parts of the service so that your children learn how things work by example. If you have to leave the service with your child, please feel free to do so; come back when you can! Remember that the way we welcome children to our church directly affects the way that they respond to the church, to spirituality, religion and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship. Please let your child use the reverse side of this card (found in the pews holders) to draw and doodle. On most Sundays, children are "sung out" to the nursery or classes about 15 minutes after announcements are completed. Children who do not wish to attend class/nursery are welcome to stay with you. Breastfeeding is also welcome.

To the Members of our Church, May We Suggest: The presence of children is a gift to the church, and a reminder that the church is growing. Please welcome our children and give a smile of encouragement to parents. Leave seats in the back open for any latecomers and parents with little ones.
